

GUIDELINES FOR THE COLLECTION OF USED IBC'S

TERMS OF ACCEPTANCE FOR EMPTY IBC'S

1. The packaging must be empty
An IBC is EMPTY if all the residue, that can be removed by the emptier has been removed by using the practices commonly employed to remove material from that type of packaging e.g. pouring, pumping, aspirating etc. or if necessary a combination of these.
2. The original labels describing packaging content must not be removed or made illegible.
3. Substances other than the original product must not be put into the IBC's.
4. The IBC's must be carefully and fully closed
All caps and valves must be in place and fully closed.
5. The grading of IBC's will take place when the trailers are being unloaded on Drumcare premises and that grading is binding.
6. IBC's that do not comply with these terms of acceptance will be returned to the place of origin on the account of the supplier.
7. IBC's will be deemed as scrap if: -
 - The cages or frames are damaged
 - The pallets are damaged
 - The bottle is stained due to the nature of the product contained therein
 - The tanks have been used to store waste products, causing staining
 - The age of the tank renders it unsafe for further use
 - The bottle has been punctured or damaged significantly
